

We collect discarded hygiene products, linens, and lost & found from hotels, preventing them from ending up in the landfill.




### TO OUR WAREHOUSE

# WHO WE ARE

Soap for Hope Canada **collects and repurposes** hotel hygiene products, linens, and lost & found which would **otherwise** end up in landfills.

We process these discarded products, extending their useful life, and distribute them to Community Facilities, which include Shelters, Transition Homes, Food Banks, Schools, Youth, Seniors, Refugees and Indigenous Communities. We also help evacuation centres for fires and floods.


# UNFULFILLED ITEMS

#### 1,764,721 PRODUCTS DISTRIBUTED

Soap for Hope Canada provides us with toiletries and crucial supplies on a near monthly basis. These donations are an essential part of our Drop In Program and have been for close to a decade.

They save our small not-profit nearly \$10,000 a year and allow us to provide over 2,000 showers to vulnerable people, as well as provide laundry services and comfortable beds to people seeking recovery.

We celebrated a milestone by delivering over 1,000 seniors hygiene kits through 14 Community Facilities in Greater Victoria, aiding 60% more seniors during the holiday season than last year. # INNOVATIVE SOLUTIONS FOR A SUSTAINABLE FUTURE



### **MEET DAVID**

Our innovative volunteer's curiosity led him to discover that the plastic used in our hygiene bottles is similar to that used in 3D printing. Through his research, he found a solution to reuse these bottles, introducing another exciting avenue for recycling within our organization.

It took a year to secure funding for a shredding machine, and in collaboration with Setu Technologies Inc., we will be turning our empty hygiene bottles into filament. The filament will then be embedded in cement, using Setu's patented coating, for a sustainable solution. This partnership exemplifies our commitment to a greener future, aligning with our motto, "We Don't Waste A Thing Around Here".

Another innovative solution is the transformation of stained or damaged sheets and towels into useful rags. Our volunteers craft them with care, often packaging them in unusable pillowcases, to reduce plastic use. Sold to local plumbers and mechanics, this sustainable project not only prevents landfill waste but also funds our programs, ensuring hygiene amenities reach those in need.




